From the Desk of...

Deacon José Zamora, Pastoral Leader

A prophet has been described as someone who comforts the afflicted and afflicts the comfortable. It is no surprise then, that many would resist, as they did after Ezekiel spoke out. No matter how much or how little we do to bear witness to the gospel, we tend to feel that we are doing well enough. We don't want to hear that we need to carry our cross, or be more selfless, or change our lifestyle, or do more for those in need. We have grown comfortable with the way we live our life. When we receive reproof from the prophetic voices we hear, let us react not with obstinacy of heart, but recognize this as guidance for what God calls us to be and heed their warnings.

Saul, persecutor of Christians, seemed to be comfortable in that role, right up until he received a jolt on his way to Damascus. Now, as Paul, apostle to the Gentiles, he speaks *"of an affliction, a thorn in the flesh, that bedevils him"*. Three times he begged the Lord for relief, but the Lord told him that *"power is made perfect in weakness"*. Like Jesus himself, who by becoming flesh made himself weak, who also begged his Father three times (in Gethsemane) to be released from his suffering, who in the end triumphed over sin and death by submitting himself to the cross, Paul realizes that by *enduring "weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints"* he is made strong.

Last week we heard of two people with exceptionally strong faith: Jairus, whose daughter was near death, and a woman who had been afflicted for twelve years with an incurable, untreatable condition. In the course of curing each, Jesus told both how vital each one's faith was: *"Your faith has saved you," "Do not be afraid; just have faith"*. Today we hear Mark write that in his native place, Jesus *"was amazed by their lack of faith"*. Therefore, he was not able to cure more than a few. Faith in God is essential to the healing grace we receive. How do I react when someone criticizes or challenges me? Do I dismiss their words at once? How can I prayerfully consider their criticism or advice?

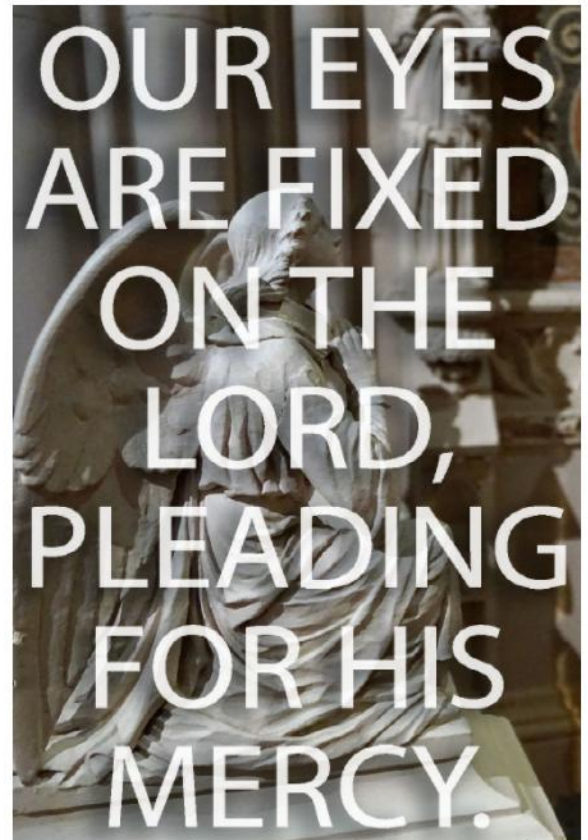

KUHLMAN FUNERAL SERVICES

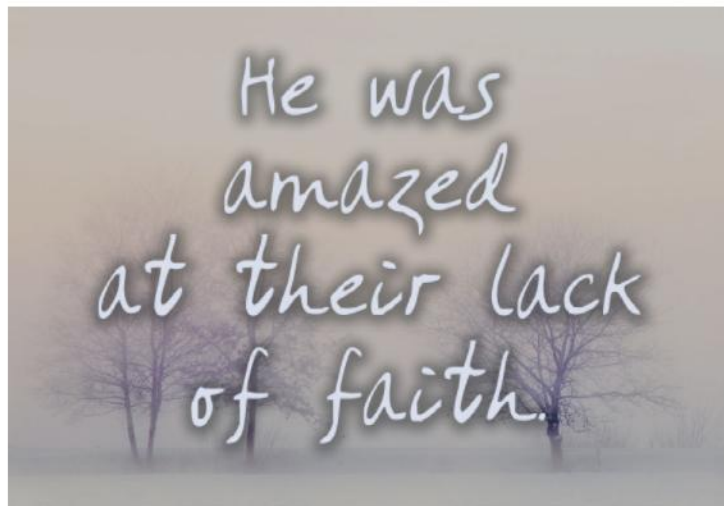

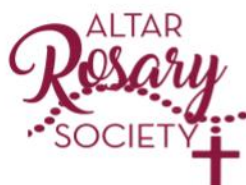
KITCHEN & DISH ROOM A/C

**Pope Francis Names Diocese of Toledo Priest,
Reverend Dennis G. Walsh,
as Bishop of Davenport, Iowa**

Bishop Daniel E. Thomas is pleased to share that Pope Francis today has named Reverend Dennis G. Walsh, currently a priest and pastor of the Diocese of Toledo, as the 10th Bishop of the Diocese of Davenport, Iowa. This is the first time in the history of the Diocese of Toledo that one of our own priests has been named the Ordinary of another diocese.

"I am thrilled that our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has honored the presbyterate of our diocese by choosing one of our finest pastors and such a splendid priest, now Bishop-Elect Dennis Walsh, to serve as a Successor of the Apostles. As a bishop, his fidelity to Christ and His Church, his pastoral and practical wisdom, his administrative and leadership aptitude, his love for the people of God, and his warm and jovial personality will serve him well as he shepherds the local Church of Davenport. I have had the pleasure of working closely with Father Walsh for almost ten years, and have found him to be a spiritually grounded and trusted advisor who lives out his vocation in joyful obedience. I kindly ask all the people in our diocese - priests, deacons, consecrated religious and lay faithful - to join me in enthusiastically and prayerfully congratulating Bishop-Elect Dennis Walsh!"

Bishop-Elect Walsh currently serves as pastor of Saint John the Evangelist Parish in Delphos (since 2015), Saint John the Baptist Parish in Landeck (since 2015), and Saint Patrick Parish in Spencerville (since 2016). Previous pastoral assignments include pastor of Saint Patrick of Heatherdowns Parish (2007-2015), pastor of Saint John Parish in Defiance (2002-2007), and associate pastor of Saint Mary Parish in Sandusky (1998-2002).

Born and raised in Saint Gerard Parish in Lima, he was ordained into the priesthood on May 9, 1992 for the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists), Baltimore Province, and incardinated into the Diocese of Toledo on July 19, 2000. In the Diocese of Toledo, he has held several leadership positions on many diocesan boards, committees, and consultative bodies.

There will be a livestreamed press conference, today, June 25, 2024 introducing Bishop-Elect Dennis Walsh to the people of Davenport at 10 am Central Time (11 am Eastern Standard Time). Further information can be found at <https://davenportdiocese.org>. His ordination and installation as the 10th Bishop of Davenport will be held on Friday, September 27, 2024.
