### From the Desk of...

#### Deacon José Zamora, Pastoral Leader

Pilate had good reason to worry about a so-called "*King of the Jews*." As the Roman prefect in charge of the province of Judea, he would logically be threatened by the native population's king. Imagine his relief when Jesus tells him that he has no attendants to fight, for his kingdom "*does not belong to this world*". To Pilate, a king had power, status, and wealth. The man before him had none of those things. But he did not recognize the truth, the truth that indeed Jesus had all of those things, just in a different way. In God's kingdom, Jesus was given power over death, the status of kingship, and the wealth of the countless souls who have joined him in eternal life.

A few Sundays ago we heard Jesus tell his disciples, "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many". This is the model of kingship that Jesus embraced. Jesus wished for his disciples to serve others, to want to serve others, and to live their lives in service of others, rejecting the very human values of ambition and vanity. Jesus humbled himself just to become human, further humbled himself to live his life serving others, and ultimately humbled himself by dying on the cross. This is the self-sacrifice he calls his disciples to accept.

Not only did Jesus redefine king for us, but he also redefined kingdom. Just as the king is the servant of all, the kingdom is one in which service for others is paramount. For this, as is written in Revelation, Jesus "*has made us into a kingdom*". The kingdom is not only beyond this world but is also present in this world when Jesus is present with us. Jesus embodied the kingdom during his earthly life and before he left, he told his disciples that he would always be present in those who are most in need. When we serve those in need, spreading Christ's peace, hope, and love in the world, we are participating in the work of the kingdom. Have I felt the presence of the kingdom when I have been of service? How can I be of service this week to someone in need?





# Happenings Around the Diocese of Toledo







#### Full or Part-time Grounds/Maintenance Technician

The Sorrowful Mother Shrine is searching for an individual to join the shrine grounds and maintenance team. The successful candidate will be working with other Shrine maintenance team members to maintain the structures, systems, equipment and grounds of the Sorrowful Mother Shrine and Mary Lay Home. Candidates must be committed to the Mission, Goals, and Guiding Principles of the Sorrowful Mother Shrine and the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and be comfortable working in a Christian community culture.

Preferred Skills:

- · Check grounds daily
- Coordinate and assist outside vendors for plumbing, heating, or electrical needs. This includes acquiring quotes and approval from the Director before engaging outside vendor/s.
- Perform repairs in apartments as needed. Includes painting, general repairs and plumbing needs. Determine when it is necessary to call an outside vendor.
- Plow snow and apply salt on walks and parking lots. Ensure ample salt to use during the icy season.
- · Report any major projects or repair needs to the Director to determine next steps.
- · Conduct general maintenance on all equipment
- Set up cafeteria for meetings or gatherings per direction of Office Manager or Director.
- General management of the woods cut down dead trees/chipping brush when needed.
- · Maintain sewer system and all associated EPA documentation.
- · Manage volunteers used for groundskeeping.
- · Adhere to all safety rules and safe work practices to prevent injury.
- · Participate in all general staff meetings.
- · Report directly to the Director of Operations.


