Clyde St. Mary Catholic Church

For the most part, Jesus' signs in John's Gospel require other people to perform the necessary actions. Jesus does not fill the jars at Cana; the servers do. He sends the blind man to wash his eyes himself in the Pool of Siloam. Here, he does not roll back the stone or untie Lazarus; the people in the crowd do. Jesus' miracles demand involvement from the rest of us.

Lazarus needed help from his family, friends, and neighbors. In his condition he would never have been able to move the stone from the tomb himself. He could not untie the burial bands while his hands and feet were still tied. The community had to assist. They give an example of what we are called to do: release our brothers and sisters from the bonds that bind them and keep them in isolation, so that they can walk free in new life in Christ. There are many ways that their "burial bands" can "entomb" them. These bonds may bind them in poverty, in addiction, in grief, in despair, in shame, or in some other condition that is difficult to escape from alone. We may be in such a situation ourselves. Even as we may need the assistance of others for our own bindings, Jesus calls us to assist others with theirs. We can offer support, comfort, forgiveness, financial assistance, hope, or whatever we have that can help. What can I offer to someone I know that can help break the bonds that afflict them?

FROM the DIOCESE:

As we continue to celebrate the Jubilee Year of Hope, kindly join us for the celebration of the annual Chrism Mass during which the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of Catechumens are blessed; the Sacred Chrism is consecrated; and our diocesan and religious priests renew their priestly promises. We invite all the faithful of the Diocese of Toledo to "pray for your Priests, that the Lord may pour out his gifts abundantly upon them, and keep them faithful as ministers of Christ, the High Priest, so that they may lead you to him, who is the source of salvation" (Roman Missal, Chrism Mass, Renewal of Priestly Promises).

Parish representatives from around the diocese will be present and will take the blessed/consecrated oils back to their communities to be used in the celebration of the sacraments during the next year.

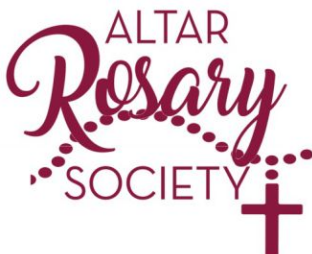

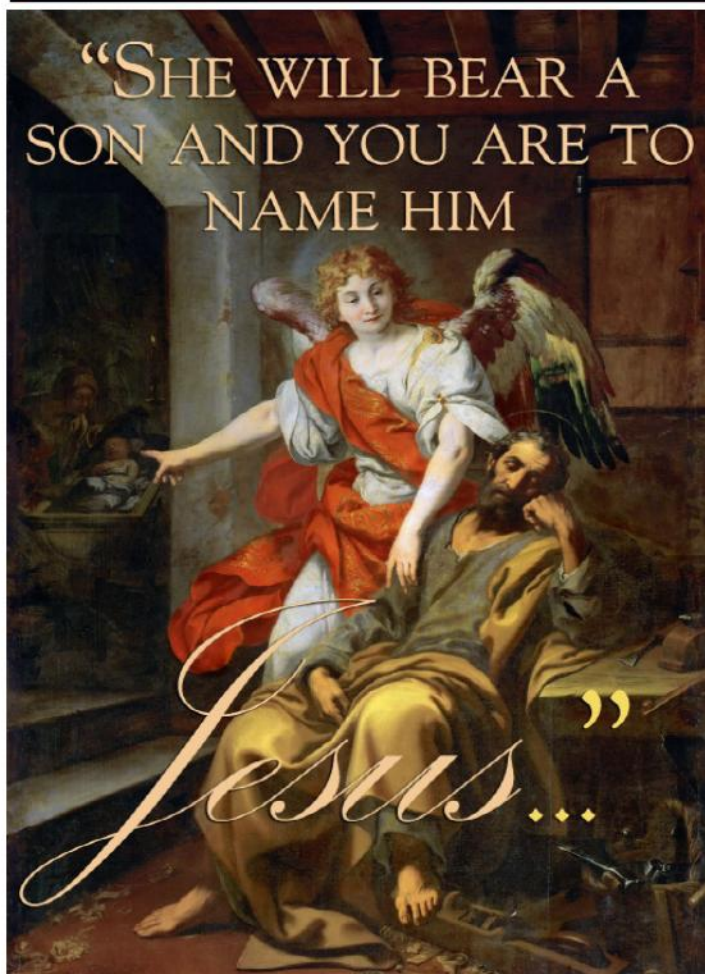

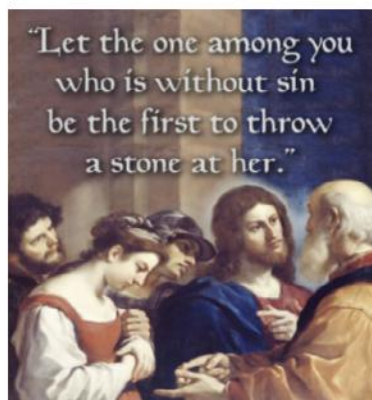
